### The Garter Ensemble A professional orchestra for amateur choirs

The Garter Ensemble has grown out of the various ad hoc orchestras fixed by Richard Bannan to accompany Yateley Choral Society, Petros Singers and Woking Choral Society, in a range or repertoire and styles, during his tenures as Musical Director.

Although this is the group's first concert under this title, many of the players involved this evening have played for the ensemble in the past, performing John Rutter *Requiem*, Bach *St John Passion*, Duruflé *Requiem*, Haydn *Nelson Mass*, Jenkins The Armed Man, Handel Belshazzar and Mozart Symphony No. 34 and C Minor Mass.

This season, the ensemble will also accompany Woking Choral Society in Handel Messiah, while future plans include Mendelssohn Elijah, Haydn Stabat Mater and Bach R Minor Mass

The group takes its name from the Most Noble Order of the Garter, whose mother church is St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle where Musical Director Richard Bannan works as a Lay-Clerk.

Petros Singers is West London's leading amateur chamber choir. We give three or four concerts each year, mainly in West London, but also in other major venues in Central London and sometimes further afield.
